FMP

- migration historically intra-regional
- pace setting FMP(RE) protocol in 1979
- staggered implementation over 15 years
- protocol recreated fmp
- creating borderless sub-region
- abolition of visas and entry permits;
- introduction of ECOWAS travel certificate;
- introduction of harmonised immigration/emigration forms;
- establishment of national committees to monitor ECOWAS programmes on FMP/V

Challenges

- multiplicity of groupings,
- language divide,
- political instability, boundary disputes
- expulsions
- wavering political commitment
- inconvertible currencies,
- economic downturn,
- rising domestic unemployment

ECOWAS Common Approach on Migration Framework (2008).

- promoting free movement within the ECOWAS zone;
- promoting the management of regular migration;
- policy harmonisation;
- controlling irregular migration and human trafficking, particularly of women and children;
- protecting the rights of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees,
- taking into account gender and migration dynamics.

TLS

- trade liberalisation scheme for free movement of goods: a free trade zone
- expansion of intra-regional trade, presently 11%
- scarping of ubiquitous border barriers; extortion, harassment
- introduction of harmonised customs regime;
- harmonisation of economic and financial policies.
- introduction of the Brown Card motor vehicle insurance scheme;
