Brief description

The Member States of the United Nations will convene in Marrakech on 10 and 11 December to adopt the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM). While the Compact itself was the product of intense negotiations, and many compromises, the road *from* Marrakesh will be at least as challenging as the road that led *to* the Marrakesh conference. Negotiated in the shadow of the 2015-2016 global migration crises, the promise of the Compact rests on a recognition that addressing the challenges, and capturing the benefits, of migration requires true international cooperation. Achieving real, meaningful action on the commitments agreed to in Marrakech will thus require a renewed commitment to coordination among countries of origin, destination and transit as well as UN agencies, donors, and implementing partners.

This panel discussion, co-hosted by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and the Migration Policy Institute (MPI), will look toward "". Panelists will consider where coordination is most needed to achieve the commitments laid out in the GCM, and what mechanisms can make coordination at all levels more effective, particularly as the International Organization for Migration enters the UN system.
