Honourable Ministers,

Distinguished Delegates,

I warmly welcome you all to this reception marking the end of the second day of GFMD deliberations.

As the Chair of 2014-2015 of GFMD, we intend to promote the positive linkages between migration and development; by protecting the human and labour rights of migrants and devising policies to strengthen the impact of human mobility for sustainable development.

Based on this legacy, we are today engaged in a humanitarian diplomacy aiming to alleviate all types of humanitarian crises.
