

## Dialogue on the Implementation of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM)

## 24 January, 2020 Centro de Convenciones Metropolitano de Quito Room: Panecillo 4

The Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM) invites the GFMD to "provide a space for annual informal exchange on the implementation of the Global Compact, and report the findings, best practices and innovative approaches to the International Migration Review Forum" (Paragraph 51, GCM). With this mandate, the GFMD 2019 Ecuador Chair has provided targeted opportunities for GFMD stakeholders to reflect on the GFMD's relationship with the GCM.

On 21-22 March 2019, the Chair, in partnership with the Governments of Bahrain and the Philippines, organized a GFMD thematic workshop on GCM implementation. On 4 April 2019, the Chair convened an informal consultation on the relationship between the GFMD and the Global Compact for Migration. On 29 May 2019, the Chair invited the co-facilitators of the International Migration Review Forum (IMRF) to brief the Friends of the Forum on the state of play of the IMRF process in New York.

Moreover, the Chair has tasked the GFMD Working Group on Sustainable Development and International Migration to lead the consideration of the recommendations laid out in the Ten-Year Review report, so that the GFMD could become fit for purpose in the era of the GCM implementation.

These efforts have, first and foremost, reaffirmed that the GFMD's added value goes beyond the GCM. Being state-led, informal, voluntary and inclusive are the core principles on which the GFMD is organized, and that the GFMD aims to facilitate free discussions, and not to hold to account. In conjunction with this, the feedback from these events suggested that the GFMD could continue to serve a role as a peerlearning space for interested states to share experiences regarding the implementation of the GCM With the adoption of the GCM, States commit to promote a whole-of-government and whole-of-society approach in its implementation, and to cooperate at the international and regional levels, on the basis of shared responsibility, in order to harness the opportunities of migration, and to address more efficiently its challenges, in accordance with international law.

There are 272 million international migrants in the world<sup>1</sup>, this number reflects the need to start a collaborative action to foster the implementation of the GCM. Therefore, at the Twelfth GFMD Summit to be held in Quito on 20-24 January 2020, the Chairmanship of Ecuador has decided to provide a dedicated space, in which interested governments and other stakeholders can share experiences and concrete initiatives on their implementation of the GCM on a voluntary basis. They are also encouraged to share their views about challenges and lessons learned, as well as progress achieved to date. In keeping with the informal nature of the GFMD, the event will be co-organized with the UN Network on Migration (UNMN) in the spirit of peer exchange and learning.
