

GFMD Dialogue on the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration

Palais des Nations, Geneva, 6 April, 2017

According to the negotiated modalities for the intergovernmental negotiations of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration, the phase 1 (consultations) of the process is set to start in April and last until November 2017. The New York Declaration recognized the valuable role of the GFMD in promoting a better understanding of international migration and development issues, and envisaged a contribution from the GFMD to the Global Compact on Migration. This was re-confirmed in the modalities. On its own volition, the GFMD started internal consultations by convening a GFMD Dialogue on the Global Compact on 14 November, 2016 in New York and at the GFMD Summit in Dhaka. Furthermore, a GFMD Dialogue on the Global Compact took place on 2 February, 2017 upon the initiative of the GFMD 2017-2018 Co-Chairmanship. At this occasion, an approach on how the GFMD could contribute to the compact process was suggested, that was described with the three "S" – Substance, Space and Stakeholders.

At the GFMD Dialogue on the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration, scheduled on April 6, the GFMD 2017-2018 Co-Chairs Germany and Morocco would like to apply this approach.

- This event will offer the Friends of the Forum a space for trust-building and constructiveness as it fosters the sharing of narratives and exchange of practices, and facilitates the dialogue needed to substantiate the Global Compact.
- It will allow reflections on the substance already collected throughout the ten years of the GFMD on selected topics while assembling new ideas and approaches.
- Finally, the event will allow for different stakeholders to engage in the dialogue, while maintaining the state-led character of the GFMD.

We expect this dialogue to substantiate the envisaged GFMD input to the stock-taking meeting for the Global Compact, to be held in Mexico in late November 2017. It should however also contribute to the internal reflections within governments and other stakeholders on their individual inputs to the process, notably the informal thematic sessions and the stock-taking meeting.
