The goal of the Lab is to find partnership solutions to a number of narrowly-defined problems faced by GFMD participants. These problems have been identified during the GFMD Regional Consultations and subsequent small group discussions, and will be sent through to registered participants prior to the Lab. Participants will then choose which thematic breakout group they would like to join.

The Lab will be facilitated by Lant Pritchett (Oxford University, LaMP) with support from LaMP staff, with co-facilitators in each breakout room. Participants in the Lab will use the Problem Driven Iterative Adaptation (PDIA) process, which has been developed by Harvard scholars to help governments and their partners to break problems into root causes, identify entry points, search for possible solutions, and take action.

For those who would like to attend the Lab in person, there will be physical breakout rooms at the CICG venue in Geneva available. However, if you are planning to join the Lab in person, you will still need to bring your own laptop and a set of headphones to be able to participate. The physical rooms will provide space to connect, network and brainstorm with your colleagues, but the content of the Lab will be facilitated online only. Please do not plan on sharing a laptop with your colleagues.

Unfortunately, we will not be able to provide translation during the Lab and its breakouts. The sessions will be conducted in English, but participants may be able to translate for each other.

We look forward to welcoming you to the first Migration Lab session.
