




Number of international migrants classified by region of origin and destination, 2017






United Nations geographical subregions

Strength and weaknesses of regional mobility cooperation

Strengths

- Common history, language and cultural proximity, similar levels of development
- Easier to reach consensus within a smaller number of countries
- Regional specificities may be better addressed at the regional level

Weaknesses


- Migration does not only take place regionally
- The bilateral level may be more relevant and efficient
- Overlapping membership (poor implementation or incoherence)



Benefits of regional mobility cooperation


The GCM points to the need to intensify the work on policy coherence and recognises the regional nature of migration flows.

Along these lines, regional mobility cooperation:






Policy coherence, migration and development

The intended results (legal provisions) and actual effects (implementation) may vary significantly


