There is no UN or any specialized International Organization which has exclusive mandate on the displaced persons. The sovereign states need to take care of its citizens including the displaced people staying with its territory without any kind of discrimination.

Welfare of the displaced persons and their integration in the society is a classical case where no single solution fits for all cases. There is need to assess the requirements of the affected people and involve them in all aspects of the decision making. Any outside intervention and international support should be done on the invitation of state and efforts should be made to support the local and national action in accordance with UNGA Resolution No. 46/182 of December 1991 on strengthening of the emergency coordination for humanitarian action.
